

Parks/ Outdoor Recreation Grants

Act 799 of 2003: Fish and Wildlife Education

Money collected from fines levied by the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission is available to schools each fall. The amount of money and the time frame varies each year. Schools apply through the Quorum Court. The following educational programs have been approved for this money: Wings Over Arkansas, The Leopold Education Project, WILD Workshops, School Yard Habitats, Total Outdoor Teaching Experience, On Target For Life, Hunter Education, Boating Education, Hooked on Fishing Not on Drugs, Arkansas Stream Team Programs, 4-H Responsible Environmental Stewardship Quest, and Nature Mapping. When money is received by the county, school superintendents are notified. If you have a project in mind, let your superintendent know as soon as possible. Funds can also be utilized to provide avenues for teachers/educators to take students on fieldtrips to AGFC Nature Centers and Education Centers. Arkansas Department of Parks and Tourism FUN Park Grant

The FUN (Facilities for Underdeveloped Neighborhoods) Park Grant Program is designed to assist cities and counties in developing basic neighborhood outdoor recreation facilities. These grants are targeted to areas of the state that do not presently have facilities, or whose facilities are inadequate in size or scope to meet local needs. Only unincorporated rural communities in each of the 75 counties and incorporated cities with a population of less than 2,500. max award \$45,000; approximately 10 award are funded annually; match may be required. You must contact grant staff prior to August 3, 2012 to schedule visit to the proposed site.

Arkansas Department of Parks and Tourism Matching Grant Program

The purpose of the Matching Grant Program is to build outdoor recreation facilities; Incorporated cities and counties; max award \$250,000 in reimbursable matching funds – applicant must be able to match the grant amount with a like amount of cash, or a combination of cash and donations.

Arkansas Farm Bureau Outdoor Classroom Garden Mini-Grant Program

The Outdoor Classroom Garden Mini-Grant Program is designed to show that agriculture is an integral part of our everyday environment. Farms, wildlife, forestry, people and cities are all interrelated with agriculture. Since most of Arkansas wildlife resides on and feeds off of private property, including farms and timber lands, the gardens can demonstrate the connection between agriculture, food, fiber, conservation, wildlife, and the urban environment. Applications will be accepted as long as grant funding is available. Up to \$500 may be awarded for new garden sites. This must include matching funds. Up to \$250 may be awarded for on-going garden projects. This also must include matching funds.
