AAUW Community Action Grants

Since the inauguration of the Research and Projects Fund in 1972, the American Association of University Women (AAUW) has provided support to hundreds of communities around the United States to advance education and equality for women and girls. Community Action Grants provide funds to individuals, AAUW branches, and AAUW state organizations as well as local community-based nonprofit organizations for innovative programs or non-degree research projects that promote education and equality for women and girls. Applicants must be women who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents. Grant projects must have direct public impact, be nonpartisan, and take place within the United States or its territories. Special consideration is given to projects focused on K-12 and community college girls' and women's achievements in science, technology, engineering, or math.

AmeriCorps State and National Grants

designed to help national service programs achieve greater impact by targeting resources on a core set of challenges: disaster services, economic opportunity, education, environmental stewardship, healthy futures, and veterans and military families. In order to maximize the impact of the public investment in national service, CNCS will fund programs that can demonstrate community impact and solve community problems using an evidence-based or evidence-informed approach (e.g. performance data, research, theory of change).

Arkansas Department of Rural Services Rural Community Development Grant Program/Rural Fire Protection Grant Program

To enhance the quality of life in rural Arkansas, Incorporated towns of less than 3,000 in population and unincorporated rural areas. Projects eligible for funding consideration under these programs include, but are not limited to: Renovations, new construction or additions to publicly owned buildings (civic/community centers, senior/youth centers, libraries, museums, etc.)

Renovations, new construction, new equipment, or additions to parks and other publicly owned recreational facilities (baseball/softball fields, landscape/beautification projects, park and picnic areas, jogging/walking trails, etc.). Maximum award is \$15,000; matching funds ration 50/50 is required. The number of grants available will vary.

National Education Association Foundation: Student Achievement Grants

The NEA Foundation provides grants to improve the academic achievement of students in U.S. public schools and public higher education institutions in any subject area(s). The proposed work should engage students in critical thinking and problem solving that deepen their knowledge of standards-based subject matter. The work should also improve students' habits of inquiry, self-directed learning, and critical reflection. Proposals for work resulting in low-income and minority student success with honors, advanced placement, or other challenging curricula are particularly encouraged. The grant amounts are \$2,000 and \$5,000. Applicants are encouraged to plan ahead. Applications are reviewed three times per year, every year.

U.S. Department of Agriculture/Rural Development Rural Utilities Services - Water, and Environmental Programs

The U.S. DOA along with the RUS is offering WEP match grants for 2015. Applications must offer free technical assistance and/or training to rural communities for the purpose of reducing or eliminating pollution of water resources in rural areas, and improving the planning and management of solid waste sites in rural areas. Applications must come from private nonprofit organizations with IRS-recognized tax-exempt status, Public bodies, Federally acknowledged or state-recognized Native American tribes or groups, and academic institutions. Wal-Mart's Northwest Arkansas Giving Program Guidelines

The Northwest Arkansas Giving Program is only open to nonprofit organizations that serve the Benton and Washington counties of Arkansas. Preference will be given to work that fits within the Northwest Arkansas Giving strategy: Providing greater access to hunger relief and nutrition services, Increasing health care access for low-income people (particularly front-line oral and health care) and Enhancing quality of life through increasing access to arts and recreational facilities. All Northwest Arkansas Giving Program applications must be submitted through the online application process in order to be eligible for consideration. Minimum Grant: \$10,000.00. Organizations interested in grants of less than \$5,000.00 should apply through the Local Giving Program. Applications are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Applicants will be notified within eight weeks of their submission date.
